Observation

This question attracted lots of candidates and the performance of most candidates who answered it was good. However, performance was not generally good because their answers lack depth. Below are the points expected to have been given by the candidates.

A. DEFINITION OF HUMAN RIGHTS

Human Rights refer to those inalienable/natural rights and freedoms enjoyed by the citizens/humans being given country human beings usually in the constitution of a state.

B. CONDITIONS FOR HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION IN NIGERIA.

- 1. Declaration of state of emergency.
- 2. Imposition of curfew.
- 3. Convictions by court(s) of law.
- 4. Outbreak of contagious diseases.
- 5. Violation of judicial independence.

C. REASONS FOR THE ENTRENCHMENT OF CITIZENS RIGHTS IN THE NIGERIA CONSTITUTION.

- 1. To ensure preservation / protection of Human Rights.
- 2. To protect life's and properties of the citizens.
- 3. To prevent arbitrary rule/injustice.
- 4. To ensure the protection of dignity of human persons/life.
- 5. To guarantee good governance in the state.

- 5. Relevant knowledge for family planning and improved standard of living.

B. ROLES OF RESPONSIBLE PARENTHOOD IN GOOD RESPONSIVE CITIZENRY

- 1. Teaching children/younger ones moral and religious values.
- 2. Supporting children and other younger ones to gain sound and qualitative education.
- 3. Training children to be law abiding citizens.
- 4. Instilling discipline in children/younger ones within the family unit.
- 5. Inculcating lofty values such as honesty, tolerance, hard work, co-operation e.t.c in children and other younger ones.

General Comments Weakness/Remedies Candidate's Strength

Observation

This question was not a popular question. Majority of the candidates who attempted it , showered glaringly that they lacked sufficient knowledge of traffic regulations, rules and signs in Nigeria. Additional points candidates should have listed are;

A. CAUSES OF ACCIDENT ON NIGERIAN ROADS

- 1. Over speeding.
- 2. Over loading.
- 3. Poor road network.
- 4. Disobedience to traffic regulations.
- 5. Poor weather conditions.
- 6. Poor state/condition of vehicles.

B. MEASURES ADOPTED TO CONTROL ACCIDENT RATE IN NIGERIA ROAD

- 1. Provision of good roads.
- 2. Provision and erection of traffic lights.
- 3. Enactment of traffic laws.
- 4. Supporting and funding traffic regulatory agencies e.g. FRSC
- 5. Establishing traffic regulatory agencies e.g. FRSC, VIO, TDO etc.

The defect to most of candidates who missed out in scoring the maximum marks obtainable is mostly attributed to lack of proper interpretation of the question. To those candidates who deviated, expected answers include

A. NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCE OF CULTISM

- 1. Untimely death.
- 2. Emotional instability/insanity.
- 3. Expulsion from school/ drop out.
- 4. Drug abuse/addiction.
- 5. Examination malpractice.

B. NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCE OF CULTISM

- 1. By providing sound and qualitative education to children/wards.
- 2. Instilling discipline in children/wards.
- 3. Discouraging unnecessary relationship/association with bad company.
- 4. Educating children/wards about the dangers of being involved in cultist activities.
- 5. Provision of basic needs of children/wards.

- 3. Fear of death.
- 4. Knowledge of the incurable nature of the disease/condition.
- 5. Fear of the consequences of discrimination.

B. WAYS HIV/AIDS IMPACTS ON THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC LIFE OF VICTIMS

- 1. Through death.
- 2. Through depression/memory loss.
- 3. Through increased level of poverty.
- 4. Through increased dependency on family, society.
- 5. Through marriage/family destabilization.

This question was attempted by majority of the candidates and their performance in this question was bad. They were able to interpret the questions and give points. Additional points candidates missed out are:

A. FORMS OF CIVIL SOCIETY:

- 1. Pro-democracy groups They work for the establishment and promotion of democratic principles. Their goal is to ensure that democracy works in a country and people enjoy its dividend. E.g Campaign for democracy (CD).
- Labour groups This is made up of workers unions who are members of a society's labour union such as Nigerian labour congress and Trade union congress e.t.c.
- 3. Professional Association These are bodies of professional groups coming together to fight for the interest of their members and the good of the society. e.g. NBA, NMA, ASUU e.t.c.
- 4. Human right group They aim at ensuring that every citizen enjoys his/her fundamental rights as fully entrenched in the constitution. E.g. BBOG, T.I,

Human Rights Watch, WOTCLEF etc

5. Religious groups – These are religious organizations fighting for the cause of the masses and good governance e.g. CAN, Supreme for Islamic Affairs.
