#### **Question 2**

Explain five factors that hamper the effective operation of the justice delivery system in a democratic state.

## **Observation**

This was a question that was attempted by average of the candidates. The performance of the candidates who attempted it was poor as they failed to interpret the question very well.

The candidates were expected to provide the following answers to the question.

- 1. Differences in adjudication mechanism between modern and traditional courts i.e., different scope of jurisdiction and capacities
- 2. Problems with judicial management and internal administration
- 3. Relevant mechanisms and procedures for court cases e.g., filing, registration, disposing, preparation of court proceedings etc.
- 4. Professional, ethical and other accountability mechanisms/considerations
- 5. Corrupt law enforcement agencies
- 6. Prevalence of favouritism, nepotism and cronyism
- 7. Inadequate law courts
- 8. Inadequate legal officers
- 9. Issues of conflicts of interest
- 10. Corrupt judicial officers e.g., clerks, registrars, bailiffs etc.
- 11. Executive interference and manipulation of the court process
- 12. Budgetary control and insufficient resource allocation for administration
- 13. and training

- 3. Poor/inadequate staffing
- 4. Poor conditions of service
- 5. Corruption, nepotism and favouritism
- 6. Negative work attitudes
- 7. Misappropriation and embezzlement of public funds
- 8. Political manipulation/interference
- 9. Political patronage
- 10. Overstaffing
- 11. Misplaced priorities
- 12. Shift in focus and assigned mandate
- 13. Poor policy direction
- 14. Inconsistencies in policy implementation

- 3. To know their input in constitutional reforms that assisted in the attainment of independence
- 4. To enable us understand the factors that contributed to the nationalist struggle
- 5. To understand how nationalism/nationalists used the media to mobilize the people for a common course
- 6. To identify and appreciate the roles of the various political parties associated with the nationalist's struggle
- 7. To identify and appreciate the roles of the trade unions/pressure groups to the nationalist struggle
- 8. To understand how nationalist activities led to the infrastructural transformation/development
- 9. To enable us know/understand the various strategies adopted by the nationalist in dealing with oppressors' rule
- 10. To enable the people, know what nationalism meant to those who participated in it and its impact on the present generation
